## Year 1 Trip to the Cutty Sark

Ahoy there! Year 1 experienced all sorts of weather challenges on our visits to the Cutty Sark in Greenwich, from the hottest day of the year to grey dreary skies, but that just gave us a taste for what it would be like to work aboard a ship. We enjoyed seeing all of the figureheads on show in the dry berth and we drew our favourite ones. We explored each deck of the ship, noticing the crates of tea, the huge chains, the food and drink that the sailors had and the piano playing sea shanties. The most exciting part, however, was the main deck where we had great views across the River Thames and got to explore the captain's quarters. We even saw someone climbing the rigging!





### Year 3 Trip to Chislehurst Caves

As any well trained, disciplined Roman warrior would know, having the right equipment and provisions is tantamount to any successful campaign. Our Year Three warriors had their high-vis jackets, full lunch bags and brimming water bottles, so we were all set. Unlike traditional Roman journeys, this one was not in a straight line. Instead it involved a short walk to the trusty 51 bus, where we were whisked away on the best seats, with great views of our surrounding territory. This linked us to the Superloop network, which was a thrilling first time experience for many.



Upon reaching the caves, the exploratory atmosphere was set by lantern lights and a brief safety chat by our guide, who ensured that no ghosts would be accompanying us on our tour. While wandering through the caves their rich history, dating back from the Stone Age, through the Roman era and all the way through to the World Wars was revealed. The children were then able to use this new knowledge to answer our Roman quiz while enjoying their tasty lunch. Our groups of warriors returned safely, in full numbers, with high spirits and tired feet.

#### **Key Stage 2-Online Safety Theatre Performance**

Year 4, 5 and 6 watched a funny theatre performance about online safety that made us laugh while teaching us some really important lessons. The actors used silly costumes and jokes to show why we should never share personal information, like our name, school or address, with people we don't know online. They also reminded us to tell a trusted adult if we see or hear something that makes us feel uncomfortable or isn't appropriate. One of the best parts was when they acted out how to be kind online and treat others with respect, just like we would in real life. It was a fun and memorable way to learn how to stay safe on the internet!

#### Year 6 First Aid Training

The children have been learning about situations where first aid might be needed. They were shown what to do if they come across a person who is unresponsive and how they can potentially use their new knowledge to save a life using resuscitation and CPR. The children enjoyed using the aptly named song 'Staying Alive' to get the rhythm correct for this. The children were shown how to make a 999 call for help and what to expect if they ever needed to do so. They have also been taught about what to do if someone is choking and if someone is having an asthma attack. We hope of course that they never need to put their new-found skills to practice, however, we are so proud of how mature they all were and are confident that if a situation arose, they really could potentially make all the difference.

#### Year 6 Bikeability

On Wednesday 9th and Thursday 10th July children in Year 6 took part in Bikeability. The Bikeability training scheme equips pupils with vital life skills. The children not only learned how to cycle, they gained greater independence and a sense of wellbeing when it comes to cycling on the road. The scheme aims to better prepare the children when responding to risks whilst cycling and to improve their confidence when out on the road. One of the aims of the Bikeability scheme is to increase the number of children cycling to school which in turn improves mental health and wellbeing. The children did amazingly well and listened to everything the instructors said and had a great time. Well done!

#### **Reception Trip to Minnis Bay Beach**

To bring our 'Seaside Topic' this half term to life and explore this further the Reception Classes enjoyed a visit to Minnis Bay. It was our first school coach trip and everyone really enjoyed it. The children entertained themselves on the way by singing lots of their favourite songs and rhymes. We built some amazing sandcastles, dug holes using our buckets and spades and hunted for different types of shells. The weather was amazing which enabled us to have a yummy ice cream or ice lolly on the beach, have a paddle in the sea and jump over the waves! Having a picnic at the seaside was very exciting too and the sea air made us very hungry. We played games on the beach after our picnic and then packed up our things to go back to school.
