Deaf Awareness Week

Danson celebrated Deaf Awareness Week in April. We were lucky enough to have an assembly hosted by Emma; a member of the Hearing Impairment Team from Oxleas NHS. Our assemblies were followed by year group workshops in which our children learned some British Sign Language. The children were brilliantly motivated and engaged throughout and could teach others the skills they had learnt. All of the children and staff who took part in this special event really enjoyed it and the children learned a huge amount. Most importantly, communication access is a fundamental human right for everyone, regardless of their hearing ability.



NatWest Workshops

On Friday 19th April, volunteers from NatWest supported lessons all about money in different year groups across school. As Danson is part of the Centre for Financial Excellence, we regularly learn about money and financial life skills to prepare children for real life situations and experiences. The workshops that took place were enjoyed by all the children and gave them an opportunity to practise their maths and money skills. Key Stage One children thought about their 'needs and wants' when thinking about how we use our money. In Year Two, pupils even had the chance to think about what ingredients they would use to make a super smoothie! In Key Stage Two, children had to think about what items they would want to take to a party and plan their budget accordingly. They also had to investigate a financial crime scene and figure out who had committed fraud!



RSE Workshops

Thank you to all those parents that attended our RSE workshops. Mrs Stephens discussed the importance of the RSE curriculum and why we teach it. The content of statutory requirements of the RSE curriculum were explained and an overview of the curriculum at Danson was shared. The content of lessons that the children will be taught in the second half of the Summer Term were presented and resources to support parents were shared. Life Education Workshops

At the beginning of the Summer Term, Life Education brought their LifeSpace to Danson. Children in Years 1,2 and 3 took part in some fun, interactive workshops focused on mental health. Year 1 participated in a workshop about taking care of their feelings. They explored different emotions and looked at a range of mindful techniques to manage these. Year 2 learnt about the feeling of gratitude towards others, about ourselves and the natural world around us. Year 3 explored the concept of accepting what we can't control and managing our feelings at such times. They thought about how they can accept themselves as they are and how they might be able to change things so that they can be their best selves. In the same way, they also learnt about accepting others as they are. The children really enjoyed the workshops and took away lots of ideas to support their mental health.



Miss Sims was delighted to pop into some the children's history lessons this week and chat to the children about their learning. In the Year 6 lesson, they were chatting about their job as historians and how they used primary sources. Year 5 were keen to share their learning from their Crime and Punishment topic. The children were horrified by some of the punishments from earlier periods of history. In Year 4 children were learning about the Anglo-Saxon kingdoms. One child recognised 'hept' in Heptarchy and linked it with seven because of heptagons. In Year 3 the children were using pictures of artefacts to infer information about Rome and discussing how some artefacts are more reliable than others. In Year 2 children were comparing hospitals now with hospitals just over 100 years ago, linked to their unit on famous historical nurses. Year 1 children spoke about the differences between toys they played with and those their parents and grandparents played.

Well done to all our children who have been taking part in lots of fantastic sporting activities, please see more information in Mr Corley's Sporting update below.

It was lovely to see so many parents for our Open Afternoon today. The buzz in the corridors with the children sharing their learning was just wonderful!!
